# **FOUR MAIN CHALLENGES:**

Higher debt as a result of past projects -Mainly related to infrastructure

Payroll Succession plan (retirement), services brought back in-house (reduction of expenses related to goods and services) and collective bargaining.

Increase in the proportionate shares of various intermunicipal boards.

Inflation (materials, gas, etc.)

**DID YOU** KNOW?

Cities and towns are required to adopt a balanced budget in Quebec. The law prohibits them from having deficits.

- · Long-term planning and vision
- Environment, safety and active mobility
- · Community spirit
- Maintenance of an accessible service offering rather than the user-pays principle, e.g., free access to the municipal pool for residents

#### Our guiding principles



- · Responsible and recurring investment to avoid obsolescence of infrastructure, buildings, vehicles, etc.
- A grant search will always be carried out (significant potential for several projects).
- In 2023, many studies will be conducted. The year will be focused on planning.




### **BREAKDOWN OF 2023 REVENUES**

BREAKDOWN BY TYPE OF **EXPENSES FOR 2023** 




