You can make your payment electronically through your financial institution's website. All you have to do is enter the Ville d'Otterburn Park as a supplier. The number to be used to add a supplier is the 19-digit reference number without the F. It contains the number of the registration number, but it does not have all the numbers necessary to add the supplier (19).

Permit posting

Applying for a permit

When you carry out work and a permit is required, it is mandatory to wait until you have the permit in hand before starting the work.

In addition, the permit must be posted in a visible place so you can see it from the street. This allows local inspectors to see that a permit has been requested for the work and that everything is in order. This way, it prevents inspectors from having to disturb you during your work to find out if you have applied for a permit and if you have received it. It also prevents your neighbours from questioning the legality of the work in progress and calling the City. If you don't have a printer, we would be happy to print a copy of your permit for you so you can proudly display it.

Swimming pool

In accordance with current regulations, all residential pools built before November 1, 2010, must be brought up to current safety standards by September 30, 2025, at the latest. The standards were put in place to bolster safety around residential pools, particularly to prevent the risk of young children drowning. The requirements include, among other things, the installation of compliant fencing, security devices and appropriate access controls. We encourage all affected pool owners to check whether their installation complies with current requirements.

OUTDOOR FIREPLACES

Outdoor fireplaces are permitted within Ville d'Otterburn Park for the exclusive use of a detached single-family dwelling, health studio or sugar shack. You can only light or power a fireplace or keep it lit between 7:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. for the period from May 1 to October 31. Only one device is allowed per lot, and it must be equipped with a chimney and a spark arrestor. Please visit our website or contact Urban Planning if you would like more information on the applicable standards.

Reminder

The use of lawnmowers, electric hedge trimmers and chain saws is permitted from Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and from Saturday to Sunday and on public holidays, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Are you doing any work on your property? Remember to adhere to the permitted hours. Noise, even if resulting directly from the conduct of maintenance, construction, demolition, renovation or development work on the building, will be tolerated every day from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

However, between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., it is forbidden to carry out work or have work carried out that is likely to create noise.

HENS

As the summer season approaches, here is a reminder of the regulations regarding urban hens. It is permitted to keep hens in urban areas, but only on land where a detached single-family dwelling is erected.

- A minimum of two and a maximum of three hens are allowed per lot.
- All roosters are forbidden.
- Urban hens must be kept inside a hen house or a fenced outdoor enclosure at all times.
- A building permit must be obtained in advance for a hen house.

The certificate of authorization for keeping hens covers the period from May 1 of the current year to April 30 of the following year. Please make sure that your certificate of authorization is valid to keep hens or, if not, you can renew it on the City's website.

Watering

Did you know that between May 1 and September 30 for the following work: installation of a new lawn; planting a new tree; new shrub; new landscaping; seeding work; it is permitted to water every day, at the periods indicated in the table below, for a period of 15 days following the start of work and after obtaining a permit. The permit application is made directly on the City's website.

Watering a lawn planted with sod is permitted at any time during the day of its installation. Please see By-law number 442-3, relating to the use of drinking water, on the City's website.

In the case of a watering ban notice issued by the City or the Régie intermunicipale de l'Eau de la Vallée-du-Richelieu, only the manual watering of vegetable gardens and edible plants, gardens and flowers is authorized.

Dandelion Challenge

For a fourth consecutive year, the City will delay mowing parks and green spaces until the beginning of June so that dandelions can be the first source of abundant and vital food for bees and other pollinating insects. Residents are encouraged to follow suit and delay mowing their lawns.

Please note that residents will have to mow their lawns as of June 1. Inspections will be carried out by Urban Planning to ensure compliance with the by-laws.

The fight against ragweed concerns us all!

Otterburn Park has received financial assistance from the Ministère de la Santé et des Services Sociaux as part of the Quebec government's 2030 Plan for a Green Economy – Health Component, for the completion of a project aimed to develop and implement a pollen allergy control plan. Pollen from some species of trees, grasses or weeds spreads through the air in the form of fine dust and is a common trigger of seasonal allergic rhinitis. Of the different species of allergenic pollens, ragweed pollen is the major cause of seasonal allergic rhinitis in all of northeastern North America. In Otterburn Park, as in most municipalities, ragweed is present on residents' properties, along roads, streams, railways and vacant lots. In order to take effective and concrete action to control ragweed, the municipality counts on the participation of its teams and residents.

Important announcement

New procedure for the collection of branches

The Ville d'Otterburn Park wishes to inform residents of an upcoming change regarding branch collection starting in May 2025. In order to optimize transportation and improve the efficiency of the collections carried out by our employees, it will now be mandatory to register online for this service.

- 2. Fill out the form provided.

Residents who do not have access to a computer can contact the Citizen Office at 450-536-0303 to register by phone. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding of this change, which is intended to better serve our community while maximizing the efficiency of our municipal operations.

- To be collected, branches must be less than 4 inches in diameter, be left full length, and not be tied;
- The trunks must be oriented towards the street and placed on the shoulder;
- The quantity of branches must not exceed a volume of 4 m3 (1.25 m X 1.25 m X 2.5 m), which is the equivalent of a small trailer 8 feet long by 4 feet wide by 4 feet high.

Street lighting

For safety reasons, it is important to ensure that street lighting is operational. Residents are asked to contact the City when they notice that a municipal streetlight is defective.

All you have to do is call the Citizen Office during the day at 450-536-0303. Remember that each lamppost is identified by a reflective plate with the street name and the number of the lamppost. Before calling us, please note this information to speed up our work.

A well-lit site prevents crime, reduces the risk of accidents and increases the response speed in case of an emergency.



SEWER NETWORK

A simple gesture, a lasting impact: let's protect our sewer system!

Did you know that a number of sewer connections on Chemin des Patriotes are currently more than 60% blocked, some even 100% blocked? These blockages, mainly caused by the accumulation of cooking fat, considerably increase the risk of backflow into residences.

What should never be thrown in sinks or toilets:

- · Cooking oils and fats
- · Wipes, cotton swabs, tampons, sanitary pads
- · Food leftovers, cat litter
- · Medications, cigarette butts
- · Car and household care products

Adopt the right habits:

- · Wipe down pots and pans with a paper towel before washing them;
- · Recycle or throw away cooking oils in an airtight container;
- · Dispose of sanitary waste in the trash;
- · Return your medications to the pharmacy.




Installation of electric charging stations

Two charging stations will soon be installed in the parking lots of Edmond-Auclair Park and Pointe-Valaine Park.

This project aims to promote sustainable mobility. The charging stations will be available to the public from June 2025.

The "Charged for Change" electric vehicle infrastructure project is funded by Aviva Canada in partnership with Earth Day Canada's Charged for Change Program.



Sewer cleaning

(date to be announced)

Pressure cleaning work on sanitary and storm sewer pipes will take place soon in Otterburn Park.

As this type of work causes air to move in the pipes, odours and/or noises can occur in your houses or bubbles in your toilets. It is therefore strongly advised to keep the lid of your toilet closed.

Please note that this does not affect the quality of the drinking water distributed in the region. If you have any questions, please call the Citizen Office at 450-536-0303.

Inspection of fire hydrants

Starting on June 23, and for a period of approximately five days, HydraSpec employees will travel around the City to inspect fire hydrants.

Each fire hydrant will be subject to a dynamic pressure test. This operation could lead to a slight drop in water pressure as well as temporarily coloured water.

Recommendations for residents

Before doing a load of laundry, it is advisable to check water colour. If you use your washer during the work on fire hydrants and rust stains appear on your clothes, or if you notice marks in your coffee maker or toilet bowl, you can contact us. You may need a cleaning product, Red-B-Gone. This product is simple and safe to use.

Road marking

In the coming weeks, a road marking operation will begin in the Ville d'Otterburn Park.

Since existing markings are damaged during the winter, the City must act as soon as possible for safety reasons. A company will be entrusted with carrying out this work. This operation will take about one week, depending on weather conditions, since the asphalt must be ultra dry to proceed. Thank you for your understanding.
